The Respiratory Care Program leads to an associate of science in health science degree which may be earned in two and a half years of full-time study. After a year of prerequisite courses, selected students enter the professional phase of the program in the fall and graduate in December of the following year. Selection for admission is competitive and limited to a class of twenty.

Once you have completed Newman's Respiratory Care Program you will be eligible to sit for the registry examinations offered by the National Board for Respiratory Care (NBRC), leading to the Registered Respiratory Therapist (RRT) credential. Requirements for licensure in the state of Kansas are partially met by successful completion of the entry-level NBRC examination.

PROMINENT CAREERS

Respiratory therapists work under the direction of a physician and assist in the evaluation, treatment and care of patients with heart, lung and breathing disorders. These patients range in age from the premature infant to the elderly. Most respiratory therapists work in hospitals; however, an increasing number of respiratory therapists are now working in physicians' offices, specialized care hospitals, medical equipment companies and skilled nursing facilities.

According to the [U.S. Department of Labor](#), employment of respiratory therapists is expected to increase 21 percent through the year 2018. Nationally, respiratory therapists earn a median annual salary of \$52,200.
