

RN to BSN Curriculum

The applicant for the RN BSN Program shall have an associate degree in nursing, a Kansas RN license and work experience as an RN. After acceptance to the program, graduates of an NLN/CCNE accredited school in Kansas will receive 33 hours of college credit for the AD nursing courses. Pre-requisite courses and general education courses may be transferred in upon approval of the Newman University Registrar.

Baccalaureate Degree General Requirements
